

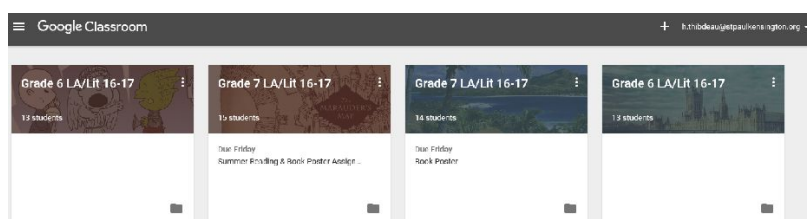
State of the School Homework Guide

Below is a guide on where to find your child's homework assignments. Google Classroom can be accessed on *any* device with internet access (computer, iPad, phone, etc.)

To access Google Classroom, go to:

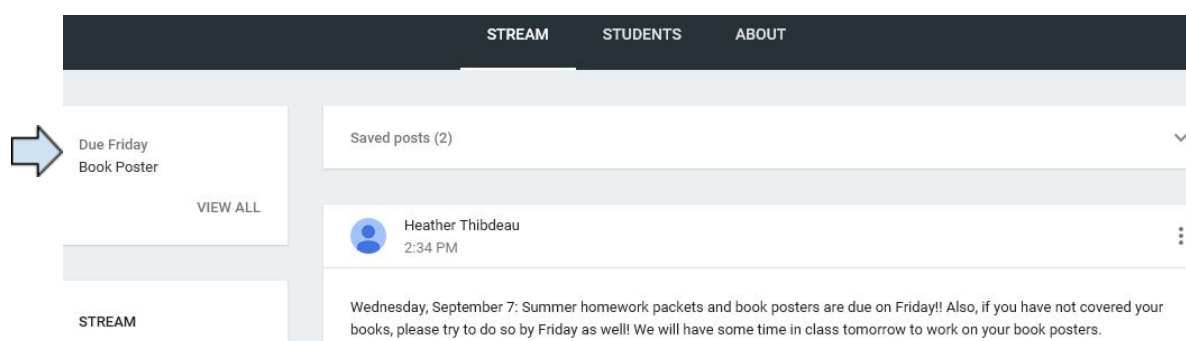

1. Sign in with your child's school e-mail
2. The page will reflect several "tiles" for each subject. Click on the desired subject.



3. You will see assignments due in two different places for that class. One is to the left side of the page. The other place is to look within the "stream" (similar to Facebook).

****Some assignments will show up on the "tiles" above, but not all!****



(If on a Chromebook, entering the website above does not require an additional login)

Where do I find my child's homework?

Language Arts & Literature: Mrs. Bradley and Miss Thibdeau both utilize Google Classroom for all homework assignments and announcements. However, it is required that the students write down their homework in their agendas each day as well.

Math: In Math class, Mrs. Howland asks that you please refer to your student's agendas for their homework assignments. We are in the process of setting up homework announcements online through Google Classroom.

History/Religion/Geography: All of Mr. Grant's homework can be found on his Google Classroom page.

Science: Science assignments are on Miss Michalak's Google Classroom. Students also must write assignments down in their agendas each day.

Spanish: Spanish assignments for Mrs. Di Cicco are written in each student's agenda. A Google Classroom for Spanish assignments will be up and running soon!
